(Demolition of existing house and outbuildings on the property)

This is to advise that the Howard County Health Department recommends issuance of the demolition permit for the above referenced property.

The house was previously connected to public water and sewer and the disconnection of these services are guided by the Department of Public Works Utilities Department's local regulations.

There was no evidence of a potable well or onsite septic system during the site inspection conducted on July 2, 2020. If during the demolition any potable wells are found, they must be sealed and abandoned according to *COMAR 26.04.04.34*. A well abandonment report by a MD Licensed Well Driller must be submitted to this office which confirms proper well abandonment completion. If any onsite septic system components are found during the demolition they must also be properly abandoned according to local and State code by a licensed septic contractor.

According to utility records, this property has access to public water and sewer. If you plan to re-build on this parcel, you will need to connect to public water and sewer per Howard County specifications and regulations
