**MEMORANDUM**

**TO:** Environmental Health Directors, Water & Sewer Program Supervisors and Water Quality Program Supervisors

**FROM:** Ted Elkin, Chief, Division of Milk Control

**DATE:** October 4, 2005

**SUBJECT:** Water Supplies on Dairy Farms

The purpose of this memorandum is to request assistance from the local health departments in reference to water supplies on dairy farms. The Office of Food Protection and Consumer Health Services, Division of Milk Control (the Division) requests that the local health departments contact our Hagerstown Regional Office for the following reasons:

1. When a well permit application for a dairy farm is received to allow our Division to jointly site the well and/or exchange information with the Sanitarian. A list of dairy farms in your county is attached.
2. If a dairy farm is required or requests to install treatment of any kind. Again, to allow the exchange of information and to communicate what is required by both the local health department and the Division. For example, the Division requires that a solenoid and intensity meter be installed on all ultraviolet lights. The Division also requires a sediment filter be installed prior to the ultraviolet light.

This Division has enjoyed working with the local health departments and is looking forward to continuing a cooperative effort. Please contact our Hagerstown Regional Office, Laurie Bucher, at 301-791-4779, if you have any questions. Again, thank you for your assistance.
