Mr. Mittal,

This letter is being issued in response to your waiver request dated March 23, 2023. The proposed pool location, decking, and retaining wall less than three feet in height have been approved as shown on the permit plot plan prepared by ESE Consultants.

Be advised that a condition of this waiver requires temporary fencing to be installed along the western boundary of the sewage disposal area and septic tanks prior to Health Department approval of the building permit to prevent any vehicle or construction equipment traffic in those areas. Vehicle and equipment access for construction of the pool will need to occur in such a manor to avoid the platted sewage disposal area and tanks.

Any deviations from the proposed work illustrated on the plot plan will be subject to further review by this department.

Any questions regarding this decision may be directed to the Well and Septic Program of the Howard County Health Department.

Dear Mr. Davis,

I recently settled on a newly built home at 10509 Pudding Lane, Ellicott City, which is in the Kings Forest development.

I have contracted with Anthony & Sylvan Pools to construct an inground concrete pool with spa, and paver deck surround.

As you can see by the plat, Toll Brothers has placed drywells very close to the middle of the rear yard and the septic reserve is 50' from the house. This has made it pretty much impossible to maintain the 20' septic reserve and 10 from the dry wells.

I've attached two plats. One does not have the pool drawn to make it a little clearer and the second has the pool, proposed paver deck, proposed retaining wall, fence, pool equipment and setbacks.

Note that the waterline of the spa to the septic reserve area is 11'-6", meaning I am asking for an 8'-6" "variance".

Please let me know if you have further questions for myself, my pool builder or Toll Brothers.
