This is to advise you that the septic system for the above referenced property has been installed and inspected. **Final approval of the septic system was granted on 11/05/2009. Final approval of the well line connection to the dwelling was approved on 11/06/2009.**

The water sample results indicate that the water samples submitted for testing were free of coliform and fecal coliform bacteria at the time of sampling and are bacteriologically safe for drinking. The water sample results were found to be in compliance with COMAR water quality standards.

Gross Alpha and Beta samples were also collected on 11/24/2009. Both findings were below the maximum limit suggested by the EPA. At the time of the testing and with respect to these parameters, the future well water supply appears safe for all uses. No addition testing **for these parameters** will be required to secure the future Use and Occupancy.

Enclosed with this certificate, are copies of the septic permit and the as-built, along with important information regarding the use and maintenance of your septic system. INTERIM CERTIFICATE OF POTABILITY

This certifies that the initial sampling requirements of COMAR 26.04.04 "Well Regulations" have been met for the water supply system installed under well permit #HO-94-3682. Although the submitted sample results are in compliance with COMAR standards, the Health Department does not guarantee water supplies. Based upon satisfactory investigation and evaluation, the Howard County Health Department as authorized by the Maryland Department of the Environment accepts this well system as required by COMAR 26.04.04.

This certificate may become final upon completion of the second bacteriological test, which is to be taken by the county health department within six months of receipt of this letter. **Please contact (410) 313-1773 to schedule a final water sample appointment. Currently, there is no charge for this final sampling.**
